WELCOME

Dear Parent/Guardian/Carer,

We are pleased to offer your child a place at Land of Learning Nursery and Primary School.

You will be eligible for the Education Grant for 15 hours a week until the end of term following your child's 5th Birthday.

If your child is not eligible for the Education Grant or you are taking extra sessions, the cost of 1 session (3 hours) will be £10.50, which is to be paid half-termly in advance. Charges will not be incurred when the school is closed for holidays. However charges will still need to be paid if your child is absent for any reason.

No child may register or attend any other playgroup/Nursery/School at the time of registering with Land of Learning Nursery and Primary School for funded sessions since this may affect the allocation of the Nursery Education Grant to which your child is entitled. In the event of no notification, termination of your child's place may result and full charges will be incurred.

Home Visits:

Your child nursery practitioner will visit you and your child at home. They will bring an activity to do with your child and is an opportunity to get to know the child in a familiar environment.

Settling-in Process

To assist the children in settling in, we have a staggered intake which means your child will start at a specific time and day. The start date and time is in the home visit letter.

We request the mother/guardian/carer to come in prepared to stay with your child, until the staff members feel your child is settled and happy to separate from you. This process may take a couple of days but InshaA.... In the long term your child will be much more confident and happier to attend the Nursery at Land of Learning Nursery and Primary School.

Uniform

Please dress your child in their Land of Learning Uniform. Please remember to bring their gym bag with their black plimsolls in.

We hope this welcome booklet provides you with useful, informative information,

Please keep it in a safe place for future reference.

The staff are always available to talk with you about your ideas, views or to answer any questions you may have.

Here at Land of Learning Nursery and Primary school, we try to deliver an individual learning experience for each child in the Early Years, this experience continues throughout the school.

We value your partnership in working together as a team to provide the best care for your child. We want your child to feel happy and safe at our nursery.

How can I help prepare my child for nursery?

Preparing your child for nursery is very important. Here are some suggestions of things you can do to help:

- Before they start nursery, try to get them used to other people. Encourage them to spend some time with a trusted adult away from home. Also encourage other children to come and play and let your child go to other children's homes.
- Encourage your child to independently put on and take off their coat, socks and shoes. This will enable your child to become more independent at nursery too.
- Make sure they can manage the toilet on their own and can ask clearly when they need to go.
- After your visit to the nursery, please talk and discuss with your child about nursery routines such as circle time, snack time and washing hands.

Parents as Partners

Land of Learning Nursery and Primary school recognises parents as the first and most important educators of their children. We value your role and look forward to working in partnership with you.

There are many ways in which parents can take part in making our nursery a welcoming and stimulating place for their child, such as:

- Exchanging knowledge about their children's needs, activities, interests and progress with the staff, sharing their own special interests with the children.
- Provide opportunity for your child to play imaginatively at home.
- Helping to provide, make and look after equipment and materials used in the children's play activities.
- Taking part in events and informal discussions about the activities and curriculum provided by the nursery.
- Joining in with community activities which the nursery are involved in.

NURSERY OPENING TIMES

- The nursery is open during school term time, 38 weeks per year.
- We are open weekdays only, Monday to Friday
- Our Morning session is from 8.30am-11.30am
- Our afternoon sessions is from 12.15am-3.15pm

Arrival (Entrance on Evington Lane)

Child to be brought into the nursery hall

All children to be in by 8.45am/12.30pm ready for registration as gates and doors will be locked after this time.

In the interest of safety, we advise parents not to leave children unsupervised as there may be inadequate adult supervision.

Collection

Flexible between 11.15am-11.30am / 3.00pm- 3.15pm

Parents should ensure that their child is collected **promptly at the end of the day.**

A late fee of £5 will be levied if you are late collecting your child. Money collected will be used for nursery resources.

Parking

Please ensure you do not obstruct other road users or park on yellow lines or in front of the gates when dropping off or picking your child up. Not only is this dangerous, but also shows a lack of respect for our neighbours and community.

Attendance and Punctuality


Lateness is a disruption for the Nursery Practitioner, other children and office staff. Bringing in your child late may also be upsetting for them, causing them embarrassment.

Regular attendance at nursery is vital if children are to gain maximum benefits from their education. Absence can interrupt a child's learning and can lead to poor attitudes to nursery. If children are unwell or are absent for reasons that are accepted and regarded as valid, it will be noted as "authorised" absence. Medical/dental or any other appointments should be arranged out of nursery hours.

It is important for parents to inform us every time their child is absent from nursery.

This may be done in the following ways:

- Telephone call to office
- Send in signed note to office
- Send verbal message – via an adult



If the office is not notified, an unauthorised absence is recorded against the child's attendance record.

Holidays during Term-Time

The law states that you do not have the right to take your child out of nursery for holidays. The children work very hard throughout the year and if they miss any time from nursery it will affect their learning. However, if you still wish to take your child out of school during term time you must apply for permission. A holiday request form can be downloaded from our website or collected from the office. We ask all parents to carefully consider the impact that absence from nursery will have on their child's education before they make such a request.



Snacks

Our snack consists of milk and fruit every day and a variety of healthy snacks.

We request parents to send in a piece of fruit/vegetable sticks/yoghurt every day in a small tub or container.

Due to health and safety, any snack sent in should not contain **NUTS** or **NUT TRACES**.

Water is available to drink throughout the session if a child becomes thirsty.

Book Bag

Book Bags with a book will be sent home on Fridays with your child. Please read this book with your child over the weekend and send back to the nursery on Monday. Please take out any colourings, paintings or work your child has done at nursery from the bag and check for any letters. We request parents and children to look after the books sent home. A charge **will** be made for lost or damaged books.

Oxford Reading Packs

Once your child has settled into the nursery practitioners will send home reading packs which will include an oxford reading tree book and a reading record used to communicate with your child's teacher.

Reading packs will be sent home on Fridays and should be returned by Tuesday the following week

Personal safety - Jewellery must not be worn at school (apart from stud earrings) Watches maybe worn if responsibility is personally accepted.

Outdoor Visits

In line with the EYFS requirements, children must regularly experience large play equipment, therefore we take the Nursery children to local Parks on a regular basis. A consent slip will be given with the admission form, this will need to be signed to give permission for your child to participate in this activity.

Brocks Hill Country Park:

Throughout the Autumn and Spring term the children visit Brocks hill country park to enhance their outdoor learning experiences and build up a connection with nature.

The children do this by exploring the park, taking nature trails and collecting different natural resources and using them in their play.

The children travel to the park by bus and along their adventures they meet lots of different people and are exposed to a variety of different environments.

The children think back to all the people they meet and ensure they are always good "FRIENDS" meaning we must all accept Diversity.

Nursery Practitioners

The nursery has a Nursery Practitioner system; on entering the nursery your child will be assigned a Nursery Practitioner. This means that each member of staff has a group of children for whom she is particularly responsible. Your child's Nursery Practitioner will be the person who works with you to make sure that what the nursery provides is right for your child's particular needs and interests. When your child first starts at the nursery, she will help your child to settle in and benefit from the nursery's activities. The child's Nursery Practitioner will also:-

- Help the child become familiar with the provision & to feel confident and safe, develop a genuine bond with the child and parents and offer a close, settled relationship.
- Meet the needs of each child in their care and respond sensitively to their feelings, ideas and behaviour.
- Use methods of observation, trackers and photographic evidence to record your child's progress.
- Discuss the child's progress with the parents at parents meetings.

My Learning Journal at Land of Learning

Your child's progress in nursery will be recorded in a Learning Journal online. The Learning Journal will include a collection of different documents, which help to provide a picture of your child's development under the areas of learning identified in the EYFS. They consist of photos, art-work, mark-making etc. and are interspersed with observations made by staff, including notes of relevant conversations or comments made by your child

The aim is to build a unique picture of your child, what s/he knows, feels and can do as well as his / her particular interests and learning style. This picture is then used to pinpoint learning priorities and plan relevant and motivating learning experiences.

No one knows your child better than you, which is why developing a strong link between home and school is key to EYFS learning. We encourage you to contribute to your child's Learning Journal by sharing information regarding your child's progress at home, with their Key- Practitioner.

WOW Notes

We have also use WOW Notes. The note cards are stored in the entrance. When a child has said or done something interesting/progressive, it is written on to a WOW note and displayed in the entrance hall and later added in the child's Learning Journey. When the child does well at home, for example, your child helps lay the table for dinner, sleeps in their own bed throughout the night, or tidies all their toys away, the parent may write a WOW note for their child and send the WOW note in for the child to share the 'WOW' with their group.

Phonics

As you know the ability to read and write well is a vital skill for all children, paving the way for an enjoyable and successful school experience. Children begin to take part in phonics sessions from Nursery. We follow the Letters and Sounds programme to deliver synthetic phonics sessions. The programme is divided in to seven phases, in Nursery, children will work on Phase 1 and 2.

Phase 1, this phase supports the development of speaking and listening skills which paves the way for high quality phonic work. We plan fun multi-sensory sessions which involve lots of games to encourage children's active participation. They explore and learn through singing and saying rhymes, making and listening to different sounds, talking with others, sharing books with adults and other children, dressing up, experimenting with writing and using puppets and toys to retell and make up stories.

Phase 2 marks the beginning of systematic phonic work. Children continue to practise their speaking and listening skills as they start to look at letters and their corresponding sounds.

Phonics teaching continues when children move to Foundation Stage 2 and children learn how to use and apply their phonic knowledge in both reading and writing.

Parents as Partners sessions

We organise parent/carer sessions, where you will be invited to spend some quality time at the Nursery with your child. Different fun and exciting activities will be planned by the Nursery practitioners each week. We find it helps to feel safe and secure while in the setting if they see that their parents feel comfortable there. These sessions also provide opportunities for Key practitioners to share information about your child's level of development, any concerns and any new likes or dislikes. By working together we can improve practice and outcomes for your child, ensuring their full individual needs are met.

Home Activity

Once every term your child will bring home a bag with an activity for you and your child to do together at the weekend. The aim is to build self-esteem; give the children an opportunity and purpose for speaking and listening. There will be instructions inside the bag to help you carry out the activity. Encourage your child to look after the items and return to nursery on Monday for the next child to take home. If you need any help please speak to your child's Nursery Practitioner.

Parents Meetings and Reports

We arrange a parents meeting each year, in the autumn term. You will be able to discuss your child's progress with the Nursery Practitioner. Parents are allocated 10-15 minute appointments. If further discussion is necessary a separate appointment can be arranged. Reports will be sent home at the end of the year to give a summary of progress.

Home Visits

To ease the transition into Nursery, your child's allocated Key worker will visit you and your child at home. They will bring a fun activity to do with your child and spend some time getting to know how best to support your child when he/she starts Nursery.

Daily Routine

Session Times:

Morning 8.30am – 11.30am

Afternoon 12.15 – 3.15pm

- **8.30am & 12.15pm – Choose & Play**

Children arrive, self-register, hang their coats up, wear their indoor shoes and join in with activities that have been laid out.

If parents wish to speak with their child's Nursery Practitioner they can do so at this time.

- **8.45 – 9.00am & 12.30-12.45pm – Circle time**

Children come together in their key groups to start the day off with some Du'aas and discuss the weather and the day.

- **9:00 – 9.15am & 12.45-1:00pm – Phonics Time**

Children are grouped to carry out a focused activity on letters and sound to help with early reading and writing.

Snack Bar – is open from 9.30/1.30pm onwards for children to access as and when they are hungry or thirsty.

Toileting – The children's toilets are easily accessible from the nursery hall. The child will inform the Nursery Practitioner they wish to go to the toilet and will be assisted if needed. In case of a toileting accident/or the child's clothes getting wet/dirty, we request the parent to provide a spare set of clothes which will stay in the child's plimsoll bag at nursery.

- **9.15am – 10.10am & 1:00pm – 1.55pm**

Free play sessions – Planned child initiated activities and a focused activity which will be pre-planned to meet the EYFS. Children will work in groups and activities will be designed to meet their individual needs. Children have the option of free play indoor and outdoor.

- **10.25am – 10.30am & 2:15pm – 2.20pm**

Tidy up time

- **10.30 am- 10.45am & 2.20pm – 2.30pm**

Story/Song time – Children participate in whole or half group story and song sessions

- **10.45 am – 11.15am & 2.30pm – 3.00pm**

Physical play – Children will be given the opportunity to engage daily in outdoor play

- **11.15am & 3.00pm**

Wind down time – Children brought back inside and sat down. Pass any letters/ work out to them. If parents need to discuss anything they will be encouraged to come during this time.

- **11.30am & 3.15pm**

Session ends – Staff will clear up and make arrangements for the next session.

NB- The above are subject to change according to the children's needs & interests.



The Early Years Foundation Stage

Principles into Practice

The four themes of the EYFS are;



As a mum or dad, how can I help with my child's learning?

All the fun activities that you do with your child at home are important in supporting their learning and development, and have a really long lasting effect on your child's learning as they progress through school.

Even when your child is very young and is not yet able to talk, talking to them helps them to learn and understand new words and ideas. If you make the time every day to do some of the following things with your child it will make a real difference to your child's confidence as a young learner.



If you're looking for new ideas for things to do then find out what is on offer at your local children's centre. Many offer 'muddy play' activities which you and your child can join in with, and many of the activities they provide are free. Staff can also give you advice about the kinds of books or other activities your child might enjoy at different ages.

British Values

Promoting British Values at Land of Learning Nursery and Primary school

The DFE have recently reinforced the need “to create and enforce a clear and rigorous expectation on all schools/ nurseries to promote the fundamental British values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs.”

The fundamental British values of democracy, rule of law, individual liberty, mutual respect and tolerance for those with different faiths and beliefs are already implicitly embedded in our curriculum. At Land of Learning Nursery and Primary we implement the curriculum and therefore these values are reinforced regularly in the following ways:

Democracy: making decisions together

As part of the focus on self-confidence and self-awareness as cited in Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

The Headteacher, SLT, teachers and Nursery Practitioners encourage children to see their role in the bigger picture, encouraging children to know their views count, value each other’s views and values and talk about their feelings, for example when they do or do not need help. When appropriate demonstrate democracy in action, for example, children sharing views on what the theme of their role play area could be with a show of hands.

Teachers and Nursery Practitioners support the decisions that the children make and provide activities that involve turn-taking, sharing and collaboration. Children should be given opportunities to develop enquiring minds in an atmosphere where questions are valued.

We listen to children’s and parent’s voices. Our school behaviour policy is clear that children are expected to contribute and co-operate, taking into account the view of others.

The Rule of Law: understanding rules matter as cited in Personal, Social and Emotional development

As part of the focus on managing feelings and behaviour:

Teachers and Nursery Practitioners ensure that children understand their own and others’ behaviour and its consequences, and learn to distinguish right from wrong.

Teachers and Nursery Practitioners collaborate with children to create the rules and the codes of behaviour and ensure that all children understand that rules apply to everyone.

Individual liberty: Freedom for all

As part of the focus on self-confidence & self-awareness and people & communities as cited in Personal Social and Emotional development and Understanding the World:

Children are encouraged to develop a positive sense of themselves. Staffs provide opportunities for children to develop their self-knowledge, self-esteem and increase their confidence in their own abilities, for example through allowing children to take risks on an obstacle course, mixing colours and talking about their experiences and learning.

Staff encourage a range of experiences that allow children to explore the language of feelings and responsibility, reflect on their differences and understand we are free to have different opinions, for example in a small group discuss what they feel about moving up to the next class.

Within the school, children are actively encouraged to make choices, knowing that they are in a safe and supportive environment. As a school, we educate and provide boundaries for children to make choices safely, through our provisions of a safe environment and empowering teaching. Children are encouraged to know, understand and exercise their rights and personal freedoms.

Mutual Respect and Tolerance: Treat others as you want to be treated.

As part of the focus on People & Communities, Managing Feelings & Behaviour and Making Relationships as cited in Personal, Social and Emotional development and Understanding the World:

Children are taught to acquire a tolerance and appreciation of and respect for their own and other cultures; know about similarities and differences between themselves and others amongst families, faiths, communities, cultures and traditions, to share and discuss practices, celebrations and experiences.

Teachers and Nursery Practitioners encourage and explain the importance of tolerant behaviours such as sharing and respecting other's opinions.

Teachers and Nursery Practitioners promote diverse attitudes and challenge stereotypes, for example, sharing stories that reflect and value the diversity of children's experiences and providing resources and activities that challenge gender, cultural and racial stereotyping.

Part of our school ethos and behaviour policy has revolved around Core values such as respect and children are modelled this by caring, sharing and listening to others.

Teachers and Nursery Practitioners help children to understand how to respect by talking about how actions/words can affect others.

We consistently reinforce our high expectations of children. Children are taught the value and reasons behind our expectations (rules) that they are to protect us, that everyone has a responsibility and that there are consequences when rules are broken.

Policies

The Nursery has a set of comprehensive policies/policy statements, which are available to view from the office on request, or can be viewed on our website.

Below is a brief outline of some of our practices and policies implemented.

Equal Opportunities – The Nursery will ensure that all staff are aware and will work in accordance to set guidelines to ensure that all children and parents are treated fairly, justly and equally. This is laid out in our admissions policy and curriculum.

Special Educational Needs – Our designated Special Educational needs co-ordinator (SENCO) is Mrs Bobat. The Nursery will not discriminate against children with special needs. We will work towards providing an environment where all can access equally. Children's behaviour and abilities are regularly monitored and evaluated. Concerns will immediately be addressed with parents.

We also have a designated SENCO worker available for advice and guidance.

Our aim is to identify any difficulties faced by the child at an early stage and deal with it.

Admissions

The school has an admission policy available on request. Parents/Guardian must agree to work in partnership with the staff in the education of their child.

Parents evening and reports

We arrange one parents evening each year, in the autumn term. You will be able to discuss your child's progress with the class teacher. Parents are allocated 10 - 15 minute appointments. If further discussion is necessary a separate appointment can be arranged. Reports will be sent home twice a year and give a summary of progress.

First Aid/ medical Care

If your child suffers any medical condition please complete relevant forms and inform staff on arrival to the school.

Any medication required for the child's condition e.g. inhaler, must be clearly labelled and given to the teacher, who will store it safely for the child until it is required.

If the medication is required then the child will be responsible to administer it, under the supervision of staff, or the parent will be called to dispense it.

NO STAFF WILL ADMINISTER INHALER OR ANY OTHER MEDICATION TO CHILDREN, unless the situation is judged as critical or life threatening.



Behaviour Management – Staff in the nursery ensure that children are taught and supported to behave appropriately towards each other and look after the resources and Nursery environment. Children have worked with their Nursery Practitioner to devise their own Nursery Golden Rules. Staff will use various strategies and ensure that they are applied consistently to deal with unacceptable behaviour e.g. distractions, warnings, time out from free play activities, reward and praise for good behaviour.

Procedures in our complaints policies will need to be adhered to; policy available upon request.

Suggestions and constructive ideas are welcomed, however all final decisions have to be agreed by the management.

Suggestion Box

A suggestion box is available in which Parents/Carers can leave their views or ideas. These will be used to assist Land of Learning staff in further enhancing the learning environment for the children.

We operate a policy where parents can make an appointment to see the Nursery Practitioner, Head or Deputy during Nursery Operating hours. Due to security reasons, we do request that parents inform the office of their intentions to visit and arrange a suitable time where the children's learning time is not affected.

Terms & Conditions

Data Protection

The personal data collected on this form will only be used for the purpose of processing your child's registration. It is required for various administrative and health and safety reasons. Under the Data Exchange Agreement (DEA) and the Educations and Inspections Act 2006, Information will also be shared with local authorities if required to do so. Child assessments will be carried out by the staff. I, the parent/legal guardian, give consent for my child's baseline assessment to be shared with the local authority.

Child Protection/Safeguarding

The school complies with the procedures approved by the local Safeguarding Children's Board. The school is legally bound by the law to protect children (under the age of 18) from abuse. If the school suspects, or a child informs the staff/management, that s/he is suffering from abuse or any kind of bullying the school will promptly and appropriately respond to that concern.

Trips & Outdoor visits

If parents wish for their children to be included in the school visits and trips, a consent form needs to be signed. For organised outings involving transport and entrance fees, an appropriate charge will be made.

Holidays

The school will remain open during normal school term times, the school reserves the right to make changes where required to do so with respect to the two Eid festivals. Holidays are not permitted during term time.

Sickness

Any child suffering from a doubtful rash, sore throat, discharge from the eyes or nose, or diarrhoea should be kept at home until the symptoms have disappeared. The school reserves the right to refuse entry to a child who is suffering from an infectious illness.

Medication

If your child has been prescribed any emergency medication e.g. Asthma Inhaler or Epi-Pen, please inform their teacher/Nursery Practitioner and bring the medicine into the school clearly labelled with your child's name. A medical form must be completed by the parent/carer.

Clothes & Personal Property

All clothing must be clearly marked and labelled with the child's name. Children will be taken outside so it is important that they are provided with suitable clothing. Any child not wearing suitable clothing will be excluded from outdoor activities.

Uniform

Your child is required to wear the Land of Learning uniform. Please ensure you adhere to the school dress code.

Jewellery

Children are not allowed to wear any jewellery except for studded earrings.

Books/Activity Packs

As part of your child's education, a story book/activity pack appropriate to the child's ability will be given to your child as homework activity for you to share together. This will help your child to learn and improve their reading skills. You are humbly requested to teach your child to look after the resources. An appropriate charge will be applicable in the case of loss or damage of the books or resources.

Equipment

Parents will be responsible to pay for any misuse and purposeful breakages and/or damages to toys, equipment, books by their child, for the replacement of the item.

NOTE: The school will provide an extensive range of toys for children of all ages. Children must not bring any personal property (including toys) to the school. No liability will be accepted for any damage or loss of any items.

Collecting Children

Children must always be brought to the school and collected by an adult or a responsible person over the age of 18 years of age (It is helpful if we have been introduced to these people first). We will only send children home with adults who have been given authorisation to collect children. If anybody else is picking up your child please inform us in advance.

Please ensure your child is in school **on time**. A flat fee of £5 will be charged if you are late collecting your child. Money collected will be used for resources for the children.

Child's personal details

Please note: it is the responsibility of the parent/carer to inform the school of any changes to your child's circumstances. The school will not take responsibility in the event of failure to inform us of any changes to your child's details.

We operate on OPEN ACCESS POLICY where parents can make an appointment to see the child's teacher, manager or head during nursery/school operating hours. Due to security reasons we do request that parents inform the office of their intentions to visit beforehand.

Nursery Education Grant Funding

For all 3-5 year olds the NEG Funding is available the term after the child's 3rd birthday for five 2½ hour sessions per week. We will claim the funding for your child, no other fee will be payable. However if your child attends extra sessions the following charges will be made.
