Week 5

Children will be learning:

- Safeguard your private parts, lower your gaze
- The term 'Haya' referred to as modesty.
- This is major virtue and has great reward.
- A person with Haya is not a shameless person. He or she is chaste, moral, restrained, upright, and virtuous. He or she is not immodest, immoral, indecent, lewd, unabashed, unashamed, unblushing, and unchaste.

- Therefore, Islam means peace and submission.
 Muslims greet each other by saying 'As Salaamu alaykum' meaning 'peace be upon you'. Like the majority of followers of other faiths, we believe in seeking a just and peaceful world.
