

Literacy:

Fiction: Traditional Tales and Fables.

Explore fables including The Frog and Scorpion, Ant and Grasshopper. Write dialogue between characters. Look at compound sentences and write a fable.

Non-fiction: Instructions: cooking

Cooking with The Children's Step-by-Step Cookbook. Explore recipes, use commas for lists and investigate sentence types. Write new recipes for a class cookbook

Poems: Classic poems

Using Lear's celebrated poetry, including The Owl & the Pussycat, children are stimulated to write & explore nouns, adjectives, prepositions, & expanded noun phrases.

PSHE/ SMSC: Growing Up

Children will look in more detail and study the different stages of the human life cycle - baby, toddler, child, teenager and adults. Learn how we develop as we get bigger and stronger, but we also can learn to do lots of new things. For example, a toddler may learn to walk and run. A child may learn to read and write. They will explore these changes throughout the human life cycle and makes use of children's observations of the world around them.

DT: Dips and Dippers

This Dips and Dippers unit will teach children about good food hygiene rules and using kitchen equipment to prepare food safely. Children will apply these skills when making and evaluating a healthy dip and dippers. The unit develops children's understanding of the eat well plate and explains the importance of eating a healthy and varied diet.

RE: Religious Ceremonies & Respect: In this unit about ceremonies, children will learn about what a ceremony is, understanding common features of religious and non-religious ceremonies. They will find out about what happens at an Aqiqah.

Computing: Using the Internet

This unit introduces children to using the Internet safely and with a purpose. Children are shown how to search the Internet using one word; how to make sense of the returned results; how to use "for kids" to return more suitable results; how to follow links and return to the search results.

Arabic: All about school

In this unit, students will broaden their vocabulary of classroom objects, stationery and school subjects. They will use the demonstrative pronoun 'that is' to identify classroom objects and use the conjunction 'and' to link nouns. They will express opinions about school subjects and discuss what they eat for packed lunches.

TOPIC: YEAR 2

Term: Autumn 2

History: The Great Fire of London

This Great Fire of London unit will teach the children about the key events of the Great Fire of London, and help them develop an understanding of the ways in which we can find out about the past through discussing primary sources. The children will have the opportunity to increase their awareness of the past by comparing and contrasting past and present-day London, as well as looking at how life was different in the 17th century.

Science: Uses of Everyday materials

Children will be learning about the uses of everyday materials including wood, plastic, metal, glass, brick, paper and cardboard. Children then go on to compare the suitability of different everyday materials for different purposes. They explore how objects made of some everyday materials can change shape and how the recycling process is able to reuse some everyday materials numerous times.

Geography: Sensational Safari

In this unit children will learn about the geography of Kenya through focusing on the main human and physical features of the country. Children will learn about the key geographical features of the country including Kenyan wildlife, landscapes and culture. They will learn about the similarities and differences between Kenya and the UK along with continuing to develop their geographical skills through a variety of fun and interactive activities.

PE: Gymnastics

With this unit children will develop body control and balance. Moving with greater agility and coordination. Children learn to link actions to copy and create movement sequences, which they will perform to each other, evaluate and improve. They consolidate their skills and compete against each other, thinking about the way their movements look.
