Islamic Values

Tolerance:

Once when the Prophet Muhammad (peace and blessings be upon him) was asked, "What is Imaan (belief/faith)?" He (SAW) replied: 'Imaan (faith) is patience and tolerance.'

Democracy:

Allah SWT tells us in The Quran, 'Affairs of the believers are decided by mutual consultation.' (Ash-Shuraa 42: 38)

Law:

Allah SWT says, 'O you who believe, obey Allah and obey the Messenger and those in authority among you. Then, if you quarrel about something, revert it back to Allah and the Messenger, if you believe in Allah and the Last Day. That is good, and the best at the end.' (An- Nisa 4:59)

Treat all human beings with respect:

Allah SWT has honoured all the Children of Adam. 'And We have certainly honoured the children of Adam.' (Surah Al-Isra 17:70). All human beings are the Children of Adam. So, all human beings must be treated with honour, respect and regard, without distinction of any kind, such as the colour of their skin, their race, descent, social background, national origin, gender, age, language, religion, political or other affiliation and opinion, education, occupation, job, wealth, property or any other status.



Responsibility:

A famous Hadith of Prophet Muhammad (peace and blessings be upon him) stresses this importance by saying:

"Every one of you is a shepherd and is responsible for his flock. The leader of people is a guardian and is responsible for his subjects. A man is the guardian of his family, and he is responsible for them.... No doubt, every one of you is a shepherd and is responsible for his flock." (Sahih Bukhari and Sahih Muslim)

Liberty:

Allah SWT says in the Quran:

There shall be no compulsion in (accepting) the Religion, indeed the right path has been made clear from the wrong path.

(Surah Al Baqarah, 2.256)
